

Career Information - Searching without Google

Eureka:

Online at www.eureka.org - User ID: DAWOZZV – can be used from home
Eureka is a database of career information that offers self-assessment tools, information on specific careers, and educational resources for attaining the chosen career.

Naviance:

Online at www.rbvhs.org and click on the “Naviance” link. Enter your email address and password you created. If you have not registered, click on “I need to register” and input your 5-digit RBV ID number to create your account. Naviance can be used from home or any computer with internet access. The program offers a career interest inventory, information about various careers and specific jobs, including job overview, salary, education requirements, and related college majors.

The *Occupational Outlook Handbook* is a nationally recognized source of career information, designed to provide valuable assistance to individuals making decisions about their future work lives. Revised every two years, the *Handbook* describes what workers do on the job, working conditions; the training and education needed, earnings, and expected job prospects in a wide range of occupations.

Labor Market Information and the California Occupational Guides

The California Occupational Guides are a series of about 300 information sheets covering individual occupations or groups of related occupations. They provide statewide information about job duties, working conditions, employment outlook, wages, benefits, entrance requirements, and training. Also available in Spanish.
